"We got the idea when we went to last year's state Tri-M convention and another group said that they hosted a similar dance, so I thought, 'Why can't we?'" said Allison Gawith, part of

the organization's leadership team. The state convention, which draws high school and middle school music students from around the state, takes place in February every year. A big part of any dance is the music, and DJ Tyler Cornell from Mixx Entertainment really helped fuel the excitement that night. "I guess the ultimate thing is that fathers get to dance with their daughters, and those are memories that they'll never let go of," he said.

The goal of this night was to give an opportunity for fathers and daughters to spend some time together in an increasingly busy world. From the music, to the decorations, to the food, our hope is that the fathers and daughters in attendance found the opportunity to grow closer together. The Tri-M organization would like to say a big thank you to everyone who donated supplies to help make the dance a success, thank you to Tyler Cornell and Mixx Entertainment for the music, and thank you to everyone who spent their time and money helping decorate the school.

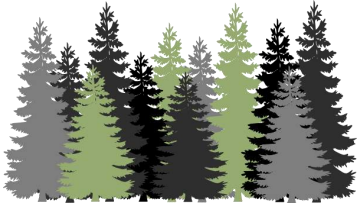

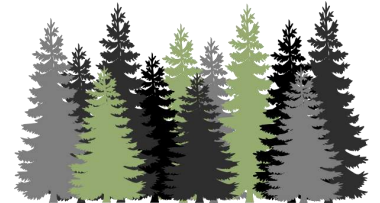

Sports Physicals

If your student plans to participate in sports next year as a 6th grader through senior, he or she, will be required to have a completed annual physical on file at the school prior to start of practice. To help ease this process, medical personnel from Susan B. Allen will come to the school to do sports physicals. This is a convenience to the athletes and their parents to get these physicals completed and turned in before the school year is out. Fall sports practice begins on August 14. Getting a physical through the summer is easy to put off and forget about. It can also be a savings on the cost, compared to the cost of having a physical exam in the Dr. office. You, as a parent, do not have to take time off work as it is done during the school day.

This year, **Physical Day is Monday, May 15**, beginning at 8:30 a.m. **The cost is \$20.00**. You may not choose the doctor. It is on the “next available” basis. If you send a check, please leave the “Payable to” blank and the doctor will fill it in.

There will also be a Concussion Form included in the packet. This needs to be read and signed by the student athlete and parent/guardian. This is a required form by the State of Kansas. Both of these forms must be completed and returned before a student is allowed to participate in practice for a sports activity.

We are sending the KSHSAA physical form home the first week of May for you to fill out some information that needs to be completed before the physicals on May 15. **With your student, answer the questions on the front page and sign.** There is an eligibility portion on **page 4 to be completed, including another signature** from student and parent. Some other important things to remember while filling out:

- ~ On “grade” – put the grade your student will be in next year (2017-18).
- ~ Complete the medical portion on the front page.
- ~ If you aren’t sure how to answer the eligibility questions on back, check with Mr. Gawith or Mr. Howard.

Softball's Turnaround

The High School softball team has made a turnaround from the last few years. Last year the girls' softball team won only one game and this year they are currently 10-3. We started the year 2-2 and then defeated Oxford 12-4, 22-12, with Sarah Hinnen leading the way with five hits followed by four hits each from Olivia Leslie and Kadyn Nuncio. Olivia Leslie also pitched very well winning both games.

The next outing was at Eureka where we didn't play very well and lost 11-19. We were ahead 9-3 when the wheels came off. The third inning we gave up nine runs with only two of them being earned. Followed up with a big error in the fifth inning to allow three more runs and you have the ball game. Hopefully we will learn from our mistakes, which should help us later.

Our next outing was against Central Burden who we defeated 24-6, 20-5. Sarah Hinnen led the way again getting five hits. West Elk was next, who we defeated 12-8, 19-1. Makenzie Jackson had five hits, with Olivia Leslie, Courtney Brown, Nyah Brown and Sarah Hinnen all four hits each. Courtney Brown's four hits were home runs with eight RBI'S. Her three home runs in the first game may have tied a state record for home runs in a game. Our last two games were against Elk Valley/Fredonia who we defeated 20-9, 25-2. Olivia Leslie had six hits and got on base ten of her eleven at bats.

Olivia is our senior pitcher who missed last year because of knee surgery and Sarah is a freshman pitcher who is our future. The softball girls have certainly turned things around and Coach Hinnen and I are very proud of them!
