





Softball Season off to a Great Start

The High School softball team is having another record setting year. Their record is 11 wins with only four losses which assures them of the second year in a row of having a winning season and the only third winning season in seventeen years. At this pace this team could set the record for best record, most runs scored, and highest batting average.

The season started off slow with tough losses to Sedan 9 to 10 and 10 to 17. Kylee Weis had 4 hits in 6 attempts, followed by Lyndee Martin who was 3 for 6. Next game we defeated Elk Valley/Fredonia 11 to 10 & 24 to 9. The first game we were way ahead and then they tied the game in the top of the seventh but we scored a run with two outs in the bottom half to win the game. Makenzie Jackson had a great night with 6 hits in 9 attempts. Kylee Weis had another good game going 3 for 5 and Nyah Brown 4 for 7. Udall was our next outing and we didn't do play very well and lost both games 3-13 and 1 to 24. Taylor Bisbee had a good game hitting the ball going 2 for 3.

With a record of 2 wins and 4 losses we turned things around. We probably played our best games of the year at Dexter defeating them 18 to 7 and 21 to 3. Sarah Hinnen got out of her slump with 5 hits on 7 attempts and Nyah Brown 6 hits on 10 attempts. Sarah had a home run with 7 RBI's and Nyah 6 RBI's. Sarah Sorum had her best night pitching with only walking 4 batters in 9 innings and striking out 11. We also defeated Eureka during the same week 17 to 9. Sarah Hinnen had a great night going 4 for 4 with 5 RBI's.

The next couple of weeks the Lady Mustangs won 6 more games defeating Oxford 10 to 0 and 14 to 4, Central Burden 16 to 6 and 13 to 3, and West Elk 21 to 1 and 24 to 4. Kadyn Nuncio led the way against West Elk with 3 hits and 6 RBI's and Nyah Brown had a home run with a total of 5 RBI's.

The Mustangs are on a nine game win streak which is a school record for softball. Hopefully we can stay focused and finish the season strong.





Third Graders Attend Agricultural Field Trip

Our Butler County Farm Bureau representative, Tiya Oppold, has been coming into our third grade classroom each month to present lessons on agriculture. We have learned about many topics from where our food comes from, to technology in farming, to safety. Last month she even brought baby chicks in to visit us.

On April 19th, Miss Tiya arranged an agricultural field trip for us. Our first stop of our trip was Griggs Bros. Farm near Douglass. We toured the greenhouses full of tomato plants and a few other vegetables. We saw several different stages of greenhouses being built. We learned about the different steps involved in growing tomatoes, how he waters them, hydroponics, and much more.

Next we headed to Keriel Dairy near Whitewater. When we first arrived we were fed lunch provided by Farm Bureau. Then we toured the dairy. We were able to see the building and machinery used in milking. We could put our finger in the milking device and feel the suction. They brought in one of their cows to demonstrate the process. Then we went outside to watch a calf get bottle fed. We ended our tour with a sample of the raw milk and a yummy cookie!
