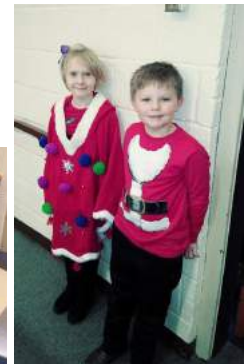

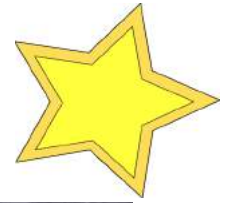

The jv played to a tie. In the varsity game against West Elk the team had only 7 turnovers with Nate Becker leading the way with his first double/double 19 points and 11 rebounds. Landon Boldra added 14 points and Tate Leslie 5 assists. The jv suffered their first loss.

Hunter Lowmaster had his first double/double of the season with 16 points and 14 rebounds. The team had 15 turnovers and only shot 33% for the game. Lady Mustangs off to a Strong Start

The Lady Mustangs are off to a great start to their season. The team motto this year, ALL IN, is motivating them to give their best effort all the time in practices and in games. It also speaks of their desire to be ALL IN as a team and that is showing up on the court in a big way.

The JV girls are now 2-1. They started the season with an exciting comeback to defeat Lebo 40-31. Lauren Donner led the team with 11 points, followed by Matty Totty with 9 points. Morgan Holcomb pulled down 6 rebounds and Savannah McCreight added another 5. Our next JV outing was against Altoona Midway. In just two quarters, our girls defeated the Jets 39-5. Kylee Weis led us with 9 points, followed by Tabitha Brown, Morgan, and Matty each contributing another 6. Next up, the girls faced a tough Eureka JV team and lost 46-17. The girls played hard and never gave up. Our JV girls have already shown a lot of improvement and we expect great things from them this year!

The Varsity girls are 4-2. They kicked off their season at Lebo defeating the Wolves 45-38. Lauren Donner led the team in scoring with 14 points. Harley Ratcliff contributed another 7 points. Taylor Bisbee pulled down 11 rebounds, and Sarah Sorum and Sarah Hinnen each had 3 steals.

The Mustangs then traveled to the Fairfield Classic tournament. They defeated Stafford 43-34. Harley led us in scoring with 13 points, followed by Sarah S. and Lauren each contributing another 10. Sarah S. pulled down 9 rebounds, followed by Janea Totty with another 6. In the next game of the tournament, the Mustangs faced Otis-Bison and lost 21-43. The Mustangs were out-sized, but they hung with the Cougars until the 4th quarter. It was a tough loss, but the girls bounced back and took 3rd place in the tournament. They defeated Fairfield 58-35. The girls did a great job of seeing the floor to get everyone involved and had 16 assists.

The girls then defeated Altoona Midway 54-25. Riggan Carney and Harley led us with 12 points each. Lyndee Martin added another 8. Once again, the girls saw the court well. Riggan, Harley, and Lynsee Olbrey each had 3 assists. Sarah S. led us in rebounds with 7, and Chloe Wieckhorst and Janea each pulled down 5 rebounds. The Mustangs then faced a tough Eureka team and lost 31-67. Taylor led us in scoring with 10 points.

As a team, the Mustangs are showing some impressive stats, including an average of 10 assists per game, 13 steals per game, and 37 rebounds per game. Our free throw percentage has also improved from last year. We are excited to start league play in January!
