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

IST GRADE







Dear Parents of Flinthills Graduates:





Middle School Boys Basketball

The jv and c team are winless since Christmas and the varsity is 2-1. The overall record of the varsity is 7 -2. The varsity started off with a win over Sedan which avenged our loss before Christmas. The boys played really well winning 44-21. Later that week we jumped on Caldwell early to take a 23-5 lead at half time and eventually won 48-33. Sedan was the #1 team on the eastern side and Caldwell the #1 on the western side. To beat them both in the first week is really great. Unfortunately the next week we played a good Remington team who played a triangle in two against us and we didn't play very well; losing 26-38. It was definitely our worst game of the season! Teams will try to defend our top three players and force other players to beat us. Remington took us out of our game and we didn't adjust.

Hunter Lowmaster is having a great second half of the season averaging a double-double with 15 pts and 14 rebounds per game. Nate Becker is averaging 11 points and 5 rebounds and Landon Boldra averaging 9 points per game. Wyatt Beard, Tate Leslie and Shane Steinhauer are the other three varsity players. We primarily play 6 but once in a while Jared Stopczynski also plays. Hopefully we will finish the season strong!

Lady Mustangs continue Strong Season

Just before Christmas break, the Lady Mustangs played Bluestem. Our JV girls won 53-26. Lynsee Olbrey led us in scoring with 12 points. Lauren Donner and Emily Wilson each added 9 points. The varsity girls played tough and hung with the Lions for most of the game. Taylor Bisbee, Sarah Hinnen, Harley Ratcliff, and Janea Totty all shot 50% or better from the field. Sarah Sorum led us with 10 rebounds, followed by Lauren with 7. The team combined for 10 assists and 9 steals.

On January 4th, the varsity team opened league play by defeating Sedan 54-29. We struggled shooting from the outside, but our post players stepped up in a big way. Lyndee Martin had a double-double, scoring 11 points and pulling down 11 rebounds. Sarah Sorum was just shy of a double-double with 12 points and 9 rebounds. Sarah Hinnen added another 8 points and 8 rebounds. Janea not only held their leading scorer to only 8 points with great defense, she also contributed 5 of our 15 total assists for the night.

We then traveled to Central Burden and beat the Raiders 51-22. Harley led the team with 13 points, Lauren added another 7, and Chloe Wieckhorst added 6 more. Emily and Reagan Heimgartner came off the bench and combined for 6 steals. Matison Totty was able to come off the bench for some varsity experience and scored 4 points. Our JV team also came away with a win, defeating the Raiders 29-15. Lauren led the JV team in scoring with 9 points. Morgan Holcomb had a great game, contributing 6 points and pulling down 10 rebounds. Kylee Weis continues to show outstanding hustle and grabbed 9 rebounds for us. Savannah McCreight, Jessie Mooney, and Tabitha Brown all continue to show improvement and contribute valuable minutes to our JV squad.

Next up, the Lady Mustangs lost a defensive battle to the Classical School of Wichita 24-28. Lauren led our team in scoring with 9 points. Sarah Sorum and Harley Ratcliff each contributed another 5. Janea once again had a tough defensive assignment and held the Saints leading scorer to only 9 points.

We started off the SCBL tournament with a home game versus Caldwell. The JV girls lost 25-49. Lauren led us in scoring with 10 points, followed by Riggin Carney with 5, and Emily with 4. The varsity girls also lost to a tough Bluejay squad with a score of 36-47. We had balanced scoring with 8 girls contributing. Sarah Sorum led us with 9 points, followed by Harley with 6. Sarah Hinnen led us in rebounding with 9 rebounds.

The Caldwell loss put us in the consolation bracket for the remainder of the tournament. However, the girls were determined to win the next two games. The Lady Mustangs faced Udall next and it was a nail biter! We had 9 players score in the game. Riggin lead the team with 13 pts, followed by Harley with 9 and Sarah Hinnen with 8. We took a 2-point lead when Janea made a layup with an assist from Lauren with only 6 seconds left in the 4th quarter to win the game 46-44.
