## From the Desk of the Superintendent, Jeremy Boldra

Dear Flinthills Patrons,

We are excited to come back to school in a normal way after a very abnormal year. I suppose that it could go a different direction in the coming weeks based upon the spread of the COVID-19 Delta Variant, but we'll hope for the best. We've been blessed to take such a common sense approach to the spread of this virus, and continue to operate as normal. We really appreciate your support by keeping kids home when they don't feel well. On a similar note, the district applied for a grant to get two school nurses for three years, and was approved. We are currently interviewing candidates at the time of this writing, and will most likely have two people hired by next week. One nurse will be stationed in the 3-12 Building, and the other at the Primary Building in Cassoday. The Cassoday nurse will also help to oversee a CNA for the Interlocal Cooperative at Haverhill.

We are also planning to finish the Agriculture Facility in the coming weeks with continuous fencing. We are really excited about this facility and getting the program back on track!

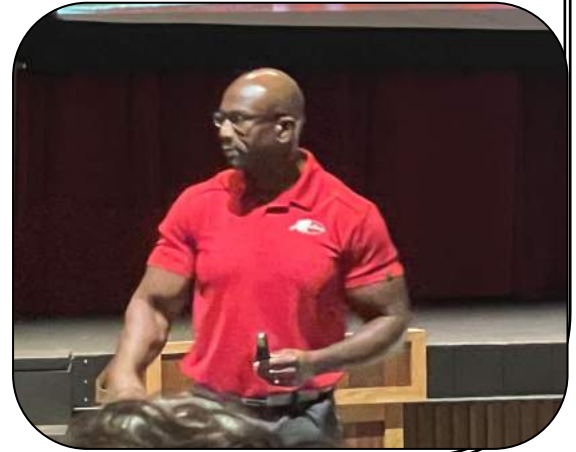

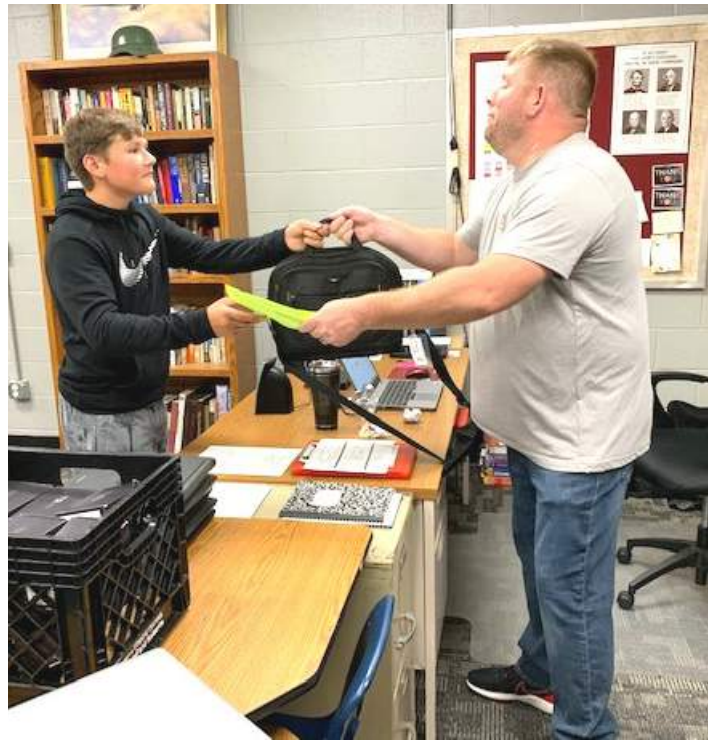

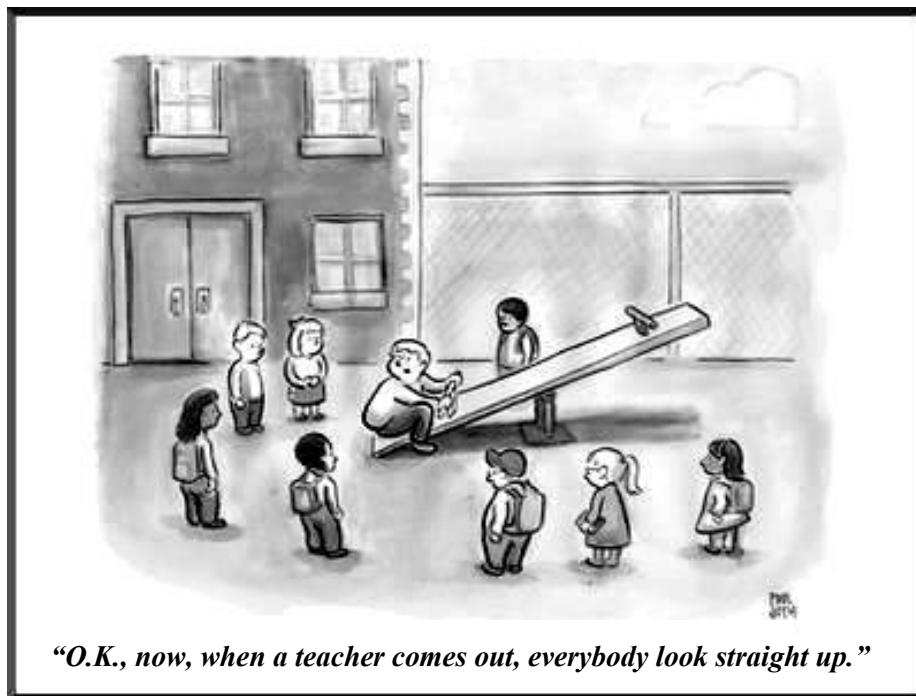

## **Title I Program Information**

Title I is a federal program that provides additional reading and/or math instruction. The students who qualify are not learning disabled. They just need extra help with math or reading.

### What are the goals of Title I?

The Title I program strives to provide an environment that:

- Promotes a positive attitude toward reading
- Improves student achievement in reading and math
- Builds students' self-esteem and confidence

### How does my child qualify for Title I?

Several different criteria are used to qualify a student. AimsWeb scores, Pathways to Reading assessments, and teacher recommendations are considered when referring a student for Title I services.

### Will my child always be in the program?

No. We work closely with the classroom teacher to monitor student progress. When a student's reading or math achievement reaches their appropriate grade level, the student is dropped from the program if the Title I teacher and classroom teacher feel the student no longer needs the extra support.

### How does Title I benefit my child?

The Title I teacher provides intensive, individualized instruction to students who need it. As students experience success, they gain confidence in their abilities and their performance in the classroom improves.

### Qualifications of Mrs. Ratcliff

- Bachelor of Science Degree in Elementary Education
- Master of Science Degree in Instructional Specialist
- Licensed PreK-12 Reading Specialist

### Qualifications of Mrs. Sangals

- Bachelor of Science Degree in Elementary Education

### Parents Right to Know

Under the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), parents may request information regarding the professional qualifications of their child's/children's classroom teachers and paraprofessionals including:

- Whether or not the teacher has met Kansas licensing criteria for the grade levels and subject areas being taught;
- The baccalaureate degree and any other graduate certification or degree and the field of discipline of both;
- If services are provided by paraprofessionals, their qualifications;
- If the teacher is teaching under an emergency or professional waiver.

Parents will be contacted by the school if their child(ren) is taught for four or more continuous weeks by a teacher that does not meet the appropriate state certification standards.

All students/families served in schoolwide buildings and students/families served in targeted assistance programs must complete a parent school compact.

All parents will be informed they have the right to request their child's/children's state assessment scores and they have a right to obtain the school and school district state report cards.

## Flinthills Primary and Intermediate

Letter from Mr. Gawith, the primary/intermediate principal....

What an exciting time to be a Flinthills Mustang! During the last school year the staff at Flinthills Primary and Intermediate worked closely with members of the KSDE Redesign team, to redesign the way we educate students in our buildings. We have been approved to launch this school year. We also worked with members of the TASN MTSS team to look for ways to improve our MTSS programs. The two groups planned separately and came up with many of the same ideas.

Our redesign team has four goal areas that we will be working on this year.

1. Meet the social-emotional needs of each student.
2. Strengthen connections with our community and families.
3. Develop critical thinking skills and problem solving skills in all of our students.
4. Provide personalized learning for all of our students.

We are excited to start implementing the strategies to help us reach these goals with our students. If you have any questions about redesign and these goals I would be happy to talk with you about what to look for in the coming months.

Late starts are new to Flinthills. During Late starts staff will be at school working on MTSS groups and planning activities that will benefit all students. There have been several questions about how it will look for students.

1. When will the bus get to my house? If your normal bus time is 7:15am the bus will pick up your student at 9:15am.
2. What time will the buildings be open? Flinthills Intermediate doors will open at 9:40, Flinthills Primary will open at 9:45
3. Will breakfast be served? Yes, both buildings will have breakfast available for students that wish to take breakfast.
4. What time will students be dismissed? Flinthills Primary will be dismissed at 3:10 and Flinthills Intermediate will be dismissed at 3:30. Afternoon bus routes will run as normal.

While last school year was one that many wouldn't soon forget, it made us think about the way we do things and several of those changes we made last year make sense for us to carry on into the future. Parents who drop their children off in Rosalia in the morning and pick up in the afternoon, please use the North door of the Intermediate building. It is much safer than having them run through the High School parking lot and around the buses.

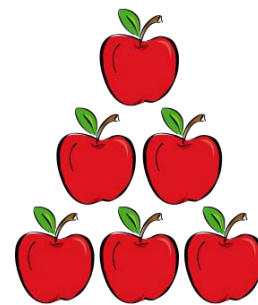
The doors at Cassoday will open at 7:45 and at 7:40 in Rosalia. The Cassoday bus leaves at 7:45 to take Primary students to the Primary school. We will also continue to stagger lunch times and dismissal times to limit the number of students in the hallway.

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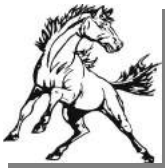
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
