

believes it is important to help spread the
work about seatbelt safety.

"It's important to spread the message of SAFE because driving is a part of almost everyone's daily life. We are spreading awareness to as many people as we can to help reduce accidents and keep people safe. I'd feel like I'm accomplishing something in my four years of high school," said Thomas.

During her time in the program, Thomas has been one of the go-to members for new ideas for monthly activities, preparing those activities and carrying them out to completion. When Thomas was a freshman she attended the SAFE Conference in Topeka, KS and jumped in to perform in the murder mystery. Thomas does not call attention to herself, but she is excited for the opportunity to leave a lasting legacy behind when her days at Flinthills are over.

"The legacy I like to leave at Flinthills High School is that SAFE is a very helpful club not just for yourself but for everybody around you," said Thomas.

LADY MUSTANGS VOLLEYBALL

The Flinthills varsity volleyball team extended their record to 18-5 with wins over Argonia, Cunningham, Udall, and Caldwell on Saturday, September 25th. One of the highlights of the season was winning the championship in the Flinthills Invitational Tournament on Saturday, Sep 11, 2021. In the semifinals, the Mustangs defeated Bluestem in two intense sets (25-20, 25-21) and then advanced to the championship where they faced Remington who had handed them a loss earlier in the season. The Lady Mustangs came out on top, defeating Remington 25-18, 11-25, and 25-22.

The Mustangs are coached by Crystal Ratcliff and assisted by Robin Hunter. They are a young team with many of the girls not having a significant amount of varsity playing time last year. Seniors, Savannah McCreight and Trena Garcia, and juniors, Karly Girty and Laura Scribner provide the most experience for the team while Madison Alvord, Taren Lakin, Amanda Brown, and Kolby Holcomb also played on varsity last year. Freshman Harlee Randall and Rylie Wight are also part of the starting lineup. Along with these girls in the regular rotation, Adley Humig, Sydney Sorum, and Emily Scribner will also play a part in the success of the varsity team this year.

The Mustangs top servers at this point in the season are Amanda Brown (92.4%), Karly Girty (91.3%), and Savannah McCreight (90.0%). Trena Garcia leads the team in aces with 45. Harlee Randall is doing an excellent job learning the middle hitter position. She has already put up 43 blocks and 185 kills. Karly Girty has also

had 22 blocks, along with 290 assists. Amanda Brown has moved from a defensive specialist to a setter position and is doing a great job learning the position. Laura Scribner, defensive specialist, and Taren Lakin, libero, have shown impressive passing and digging abilities. Taren has 160 digs. Kolby Holcomb, who played middle hitter on the junior varsity team last year, has moved to offhand this year and is quickly becoming a go-to hitter. Madison Alvord, Adley Humig, and Rylie Wight have all had play-

ing time in the outside hitting position.

Flinthills Mustangs mercy-rule Cedar Vale-Dexter in Season Opener

It has been nine years since Flinthills tasted the sweet taste of victory to start their season. On Friday night and under new head coach Chase Casteel, the Mustangs finally were able get it again.

Flinthills finished off Cedar Vale-Dexter 48-0 at halftime in their first win over CVD in the same time span.

In fact, during that span of losses, the Mustangs had only scored 44 total points against the Spartans.

Not any more.

Flinthills (1-0) came out firing on all cylinders, showing this is a new team to be reckoned with in the South Central Border League. Junior quarterback Hunter Lowmaster started out the night with a 20-yard TD run as they took an early 8-0 lead.

Senior Kendall Pinkerton took his turns, scoring back-to-back touchdowns to end the first quarter and to give them a 24-0 lead for which they would never look back.

In the second quarter, Lowmaster found Pinkerton for his third touchdown of the night on a 20-yard touchdown strike, putting them up 32-0. Then, Lowmaster would have a pick-six returned.

The Mustangs would cap off the night when the super duo would find a connection again as Lowmaster found Pinkerton from six yards out to make the score 48-0.

Defensively, Lowmaster led Flinthills with five tackles, with one for loss and an interception returned for a touchdown.

Freshman Tate Leslie also had two interceptions on the evening. He also had four tackles and a forced fumble. Johnathan McCreight had six tackles, including one for a loss and a forced fumble.

In all, Flinthills forced four turnovers and had 12 tackles for losses in the victory.

It's the first mercy-rule win for Flinthills since Oct. 2012 when they beat Burlingame 62-12 at home. It's the first road mercy-rule win for Flinthills since beating Altoona-Midway in Oct. 2011 (64-22).



Thrilling 3 Overtime Game Ends With Mustangs on Top!

The Flinthills Mustangs scratched back to .500, going 2-2 with a thrilling triple overtime win at Oxford. The Mustangs won 70 to 68.

Oxford opened up with the first touchdown of the evening and were answered right back with a 8 yd. Tayler Brown run for a touchdown. Oxford would punch in two more touchdowns putting the Mustangs down 22 to 6 with less than 4 minutes left in the second quarter. The Mustangs fought hard all night overcoming the 14-point deficit in the second quarter by putting together two big drives with less than 4 minutes remaining. One drive was capped by a 3 yd. Tayler Brown touchdown run and the other was capped with a 30 yd. receiving touchdown from Hunter Lowmaster to Conner Sigg as the clock expired. The Mustangs would finish the first half down 22 to 20.

The Mustangs sustained a couple of big injuries with starters Kendall Pinkerton and Tate Leslie going down in the first half, and the coaches had to rethink and reposition their entire offensive scheme. Senior Tayler Brown moved to quarterback. Hunter Lowmaster moved to tailback and BIG Brandon Gleason moved into the fullback position. Brandon Gleason would go to work for the Mustangs in the second half.

Oxford opened up with a touchdown to start the second half which was quickly answered with Brandon Gleason leading the charge and capped a drive with a 2 yd. touchdown run. The Mustangs found a huge defensive spark when Jonathan McCreight forced a fumble at midfield and Tiler Slaughter-Scott recovered the ball. The Mustangs would capitalize on the turnover with another drive finished off by a 7 yd. Brandon Gleason rushing touchdown that gave the Mustangs their first lead of the game.

From that point on the game was a back and forth affair. Oxford would tie it back up and the Mustangs would take the lead once again with a 1 yd. Hunter Lowmaster rushing touchdown. Oxford would score again to tie it up and send the game into overtime. The score at the end of regulation was 50 all.

Both teams successfully scored but failed their two point conversions in the first two overtime attempts. In overtime 1 Brandon Gleason punched it in with a 1 yd. touchdown run. In overtime 2 Brandon Gleason busted a 6 yd. touchdown run. Overtime 3 saw Oxford score again and fail to convert the two point conversion. In their last possession the Mustangs scored with a 11 yard Hunter Lowmaster rushing touchdown and BIG Brandon Gleason was finally able to give the Mustangs the win with a huge 2 pt. conversion.


