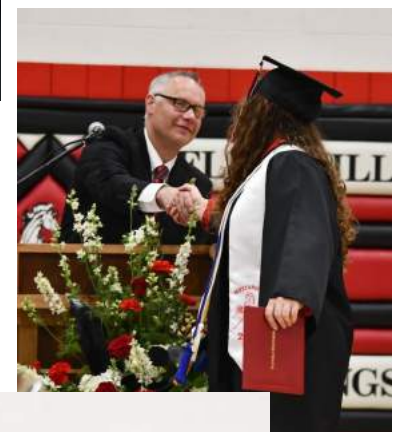
Letter from Mr. Hunter, the middle/high school principal....

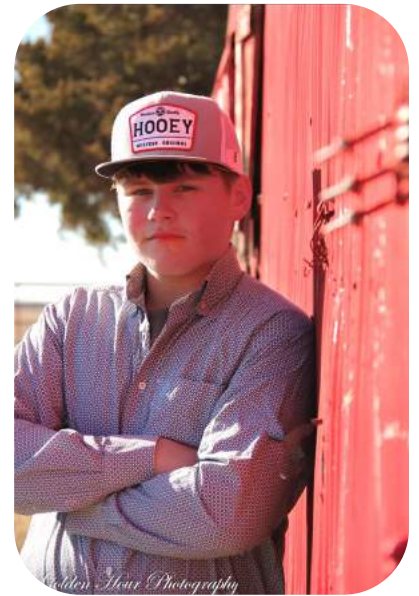

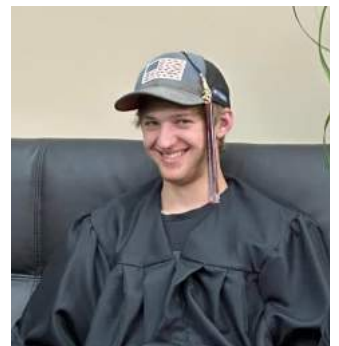

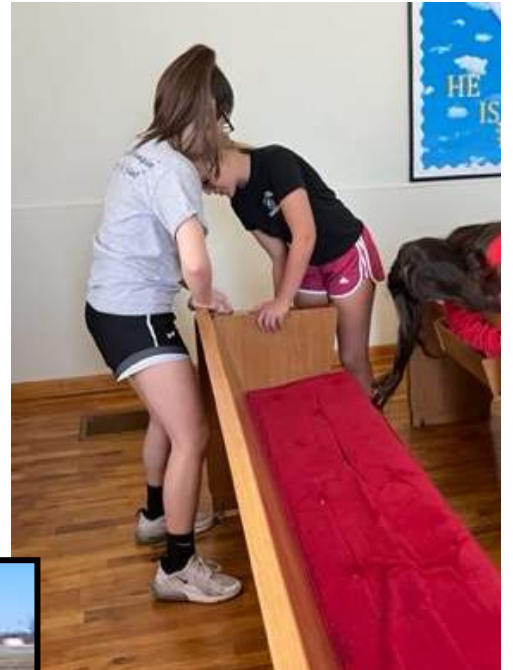
FHS Students Earn Recognition at Congressional Art Show

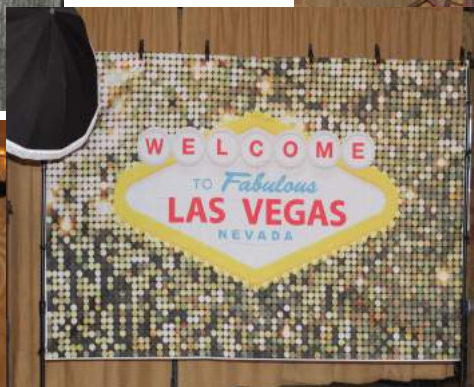

Seatbelt checks are used to monitor if our peer-education activities are effective. 89% of our students (and parents!) were wearing seatbelts when they pulled into the parking lot April 6. We also check for distracted driving which includes being on your phone, texting, messing with the radio, or otherwise being distracted. We had 14% of our drivers were distracted, so SAFE will be coming up with activities and programs to see if we can educate our young drivers.

FHS Forensics Students Place at State!

May 6th, the FHS Forensics Team competed against 36 other schools at State Forensics Championships. Four Students took Home a Prestigious KSHSAA State Medal. Callie Cordts swiped 2nd place in Informative Speaking, Kaily Gilman placed 3rd in Poetry and 4th in Duet Acting, taking home two Medals! Sydney Sorum, Kaily's Duet partner, also took home the 4th place Medal, and Tylan Willard won a 6th Place Medal in Original Oration.

Mustangs competing in the Semi-Final Rounds were Kolton Stanfield and Sydney Sorum in Duet Acting (taking 7th overall), Madilynn Thomas in both Prose and Humorous Solo Acting, and Kolton Stanfield in Poetry. Other team members contributing to the state finish were Levi Beard, Taylor Brown, Taryn Brittain, Hunter Davis and Willow Kane.

State Champs in Forensics requires 3 rounds of competition in the morning, with Semi-Finals, identifying the top 12 in the state and Finals, defining the top 6 in the State. Our FHS Team came in 5th, overall and just several points from 4th, after Sylvan Lucas, Pretty Prairie, South Central and Kiowa. Our 2023-24 Forensics Students are already thinking of topics and pieces for next year!



Students, You Can Use the Summer for Volunteer Hours

“Students are required to complete 20 hours of community service as part of their graduation requirement. Students who do not provide documentation verifying the completion of 20 hours of community service by April 30th of the student’s senior year will not be allowed to participate in graduation exercises.” (Per student handbook)

- All students are required to complete 20 hours of community service by their senior year of high school. This equates to 5 hours per year.
 - Please make sure you are keeping up with your hours so that you have enough by the time you are a senior!
 - If you do not have enough hours, you will not be able to participate in graduation.
 - A list is provided of ideas for community service. This is just a small list and not an exhaustive list of all the opportunities for community service!
 - If you are getting paid for the service, this does NOT count towards community service!
 - You may have opportunities for community service during school, but do NOT rely on only these opportunities for community service hours.
If you are a new student to this district, your community service hours will be prorated (5 hours per year).

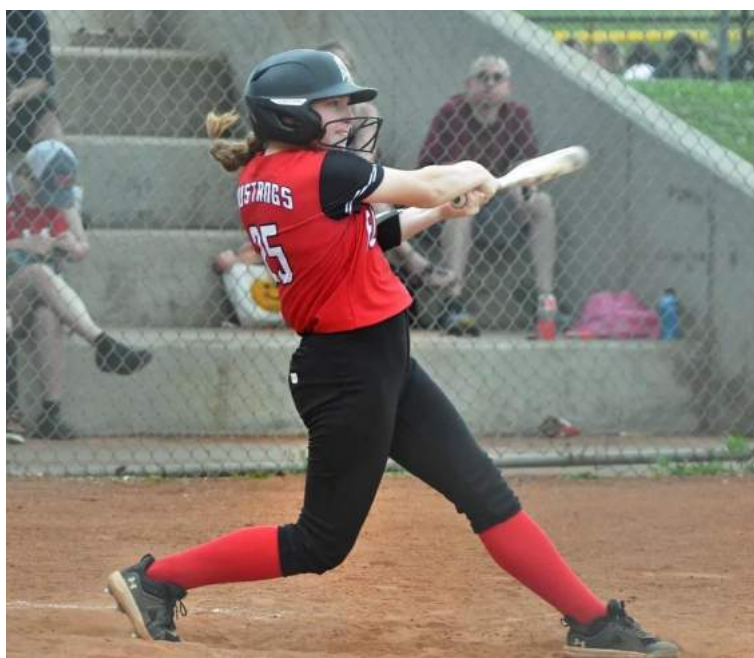

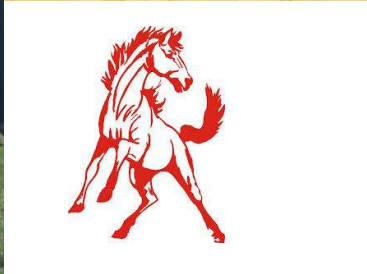

We appreciate you for all you do. Thank you so much for such a fantastic school year!

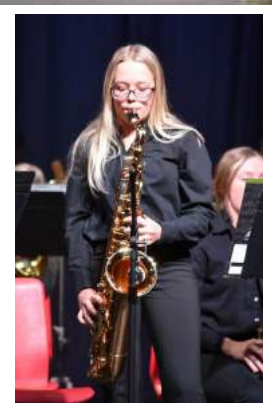
